RESTAURANTS THE LOCALS AND STAFF LOVE

CALICO RESTAURANT AND BAR

This casual Italian restaurant with indoor and outdoor seating is a great dinner choice for the whole family. Calico has a kids menu and a large yard that has balls and Frisbees for everyone to play with. The menu features fresh housemade items and seasonal produce. There is a full bar and reasonably priced wines. Calico also has some great vegetarian options. We recommend the bruschetta appetizer and a wood oven pizza or lasagna for your main course. If you have room, Calico has some yummy desserts to enjoy.

GUN BARREL STEAK & GAME

The Gun Barrel opened in the former location of the Wyoming Wildlife Museum & Taxidermy in 1993, and remains locally owned and operated. The décor may not be for everyone, as it features full mount game trophies. The food, on the other hand, is loved by all. We recommend the Fried Green Tomatoes or Bison Carpaccio as your appetizer, and the Velvet Elk or

Mixed Game Grill as your main course. Make sure to save room for traditional Bread Pudding or Deep Dish Apple Pie for dessert.

THE BLUE LION

Ask anyone in town and they tell you if you like lamb, you must visit the Blue Lion. Owned and operated by local Ned Brown since 1978, this restaurant is open nightly for dinner. It's not always easy to find a restaurant that serves equally delicious fresh fish and meat, but The Blue Lion can show anyone how it's done. Built in the 1930s as a residence, the location has been expanded several times over the years, and features an outdoor deck. We recommend the French Onion Soup and Baked Brie as appetizers, and of course the Rack of Lamb (or Alaska Halibut) as your entrée.

AS SUMMER LEAVES US, WE THOUGHT WE WOULD TAKE A LOOK AT SOME FALL TRADITIONS THAT TAKE PLACE EACH YEAR IN NORTH AMERICA.

DAY OF THE DEAD

The Day of the Dead is a bit of a misnomer, as this tradition in Mexico is celebrated October 31, November 1 and November 2. One these nights, it is believed that souls of the deceased return to earth. Families and friends gather to remember their loved ones and celebrate with altars and the favorite food and drink of those deceased. People also visit the graves of loved ones and care for these areas as well as celebrate with food and drink. Some traditional elements are sugar skulls, chocolate, marigolds and **pan de muertos**.

LAS POSADAS

This celebration in Mexico runs from mid to late December. In villages and towns across the country there are nightly processions, usually led by a small child. Meant to reenact the journey of Mary and Joseph as they searched for accommodation in Bethlehem, the processions visit homes along the route and ask for lodging, which is denied. The homes visited provide food and drink to the procession. Among the most popular are **sweet tamales**, **atole** (a corn based hot drink with chocolate), and **ponche**.

HALLOWEEN

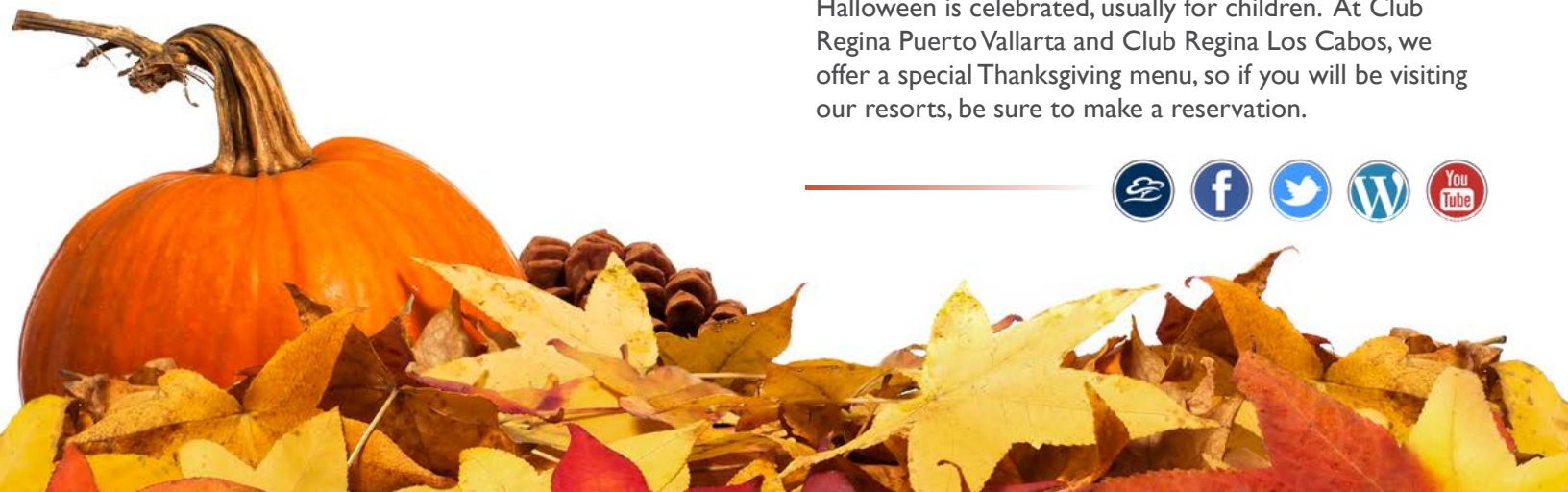
Halloween is celebrated in both the United States and Canada on October 31st each year. Children (and some adults) dress in costumes and go door to door that night saying “trick or treat” to receive candy. Costumes can range from traditional to topical. Children’s and adult Halloween parties are usually held on the weekend closest to October 31st. Halloween is observed for children in some parts of Mexico. Some traditional Halloween food served at parties is **candy apples** and **caramel corn**.



THANKSGIVING

Thanksgiving is celebrated on the second Monday in October in Canada and the fourth Thursday in November in the United States. It is the busiest travel day each year in the United States. Originally a harvest festival, it has evolved to a gathering of family and friends where everyone gives thanks for the positives in their lives. The meal traditionally features a turkey and sides like potatoes and green beans. In the United States, these side dishes can come in the form of **sweet potato casserole** and green bean casserole. Both countries feature pumpkin pie on many menus.

Over the years some of these traditions have expanded geographically. You will see Day of the Dead masks and decorations displayed, for example, next to Halloween items in Texas and Louisiana. In some areas of Mexico Halloween is celebrated, usually for children. At Club Regina Puerto Vallarta and Club Regina Los Cabos, we offer a special Thanksgiving menu, so if you will be visiting our resorts, be sure to make a reservation.

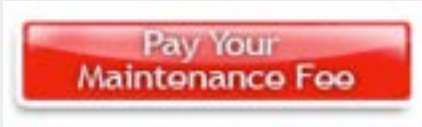


E-STATEMENT ENROLLMENT*

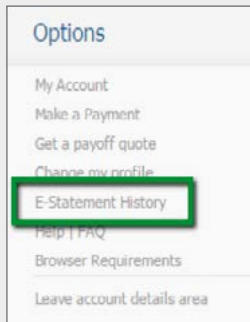

1. Log into raintreevacationclub.com using your personalized credentials and click on **"Pay Your Maintenance Fee"**

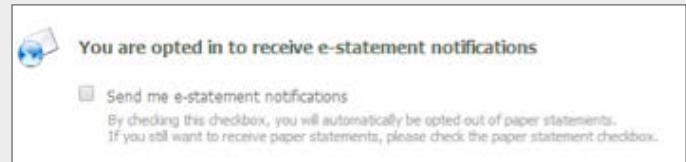


2. In the Options section, select **"E-Statement History"**:

4. Mark the **"Send me e-statement notifications"** checkbox.

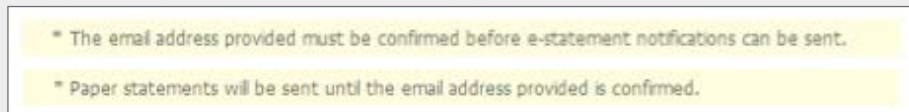


Select the accounts for which you would like to receive E-statements.

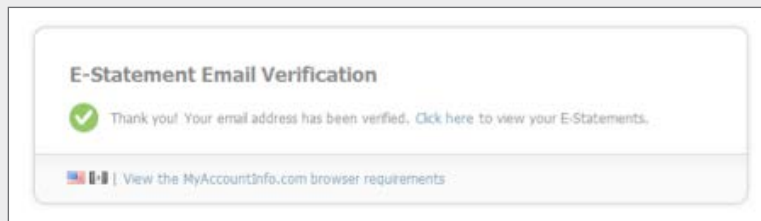

CURRENCY EXCHANGE LIMIT

Please be aware that the Mexican government (Sectur) has set limits on the amount of currency that can be exchanged (USD to Mexican pesos) at a hotel. The limits are US\$300 daily for Mexican Nationals, and US\$1,500 daily for all foreigners. There is also a monthly limit for all guests of US\$1,500.

3RD PARTY SCAM

Dear Raintree Vacation Club Member:

At Raintree Vacation Club (RVC), protection of your personal information is a priority. While RVC has various security measures in place to protect your data, it is also very important that you do not provide any personal information or any other information regarding your timeshare membership to third parties not doing business with or related to RVC.

This is especially important when you are being contacted by anyone offering to sell or otherwise transfer your timeshare membership, especially in cases where the sale or transfer requires you to pay upfront fees to consummate such sale or transfer.

We recently became aware of two entities who falsely claim to have business relationships with RVC and who offer to sell or transfer timeshare memberships for upfront fees. In some instances, these two entities have even misappropriated the logo, office address and phone numbers of RVC as well as other information pertaining to RVC.

The names of these two entities are **Golden Oakmont, Inc.** and **Liberty Royal Title Company**. Please be apprised that RVC has absolutely no relationship with these two entities and/or any other reseller. As such, we urge you to exercise extreme caution if you are contacted by either of these entities or, for that matter, any other reseller.

If you do decide to work with a reseller, please understand that you do so at your own risk. In such case, please also remember that under the terms of your membership agreement, you and the purchaser/transferee must provide certain information and documentation to RVC before the sale or transfer can be completed. Until such information and documentation has been approved, RVC will not recognize any sale or transfer.

If you are contacted by anyone claiming to either be RVC or otherwise affiliated with RVC with an offer to purchase or rent your timeshare, please contact Member Services at 1.800.424.6532 / 317.805.9167 for further assistance.
